We are thrilled to introduce you to our two new designers, Heini Turunen from Finland and Maëlis Ray from France. We discovered Maëlis at the University of Borås' Swedish School of Textiles and were immediately impressed with her talents and keen interest in woven textiles. Last spring she came all the way from Lyon to Lapua to visit our weaving mill. Her first design for us, called KUOHU, takes inspiration from water's flow, waves and the texture of seafoam. KUOHU combines our popular TERVA design's materials and colours with new, exciting weaves. Our second new designer, Heini Turunen, was taught by our lead designer Elina Helenius in the Metropolia University of Applied Sciences. Heini's specialties lie in the Finnish sauna culture, sauna textiles and their symbolism, which resulted in her SAVU design. You can discover both of the new designs, as well as many familiar favourites in new colours and forms, on the following pages.

On these pages you can also read about **lina Kuustonen** and the haven she found in the natural waters. In addition, we explore the comforting and understated symbolism behind table settings, dive deep into the wonderful world of linen as well as introduce you to the versatile ways in which our products can help your house feel like a home.

Fourth generation weavers





LINEN IS ONE OF OUR FAVOURITE MATERIALS. It is ecological, comfortable on the skin and easy to use.

Flax is one of the oldest and cleanest fibres in the world. The linen yarn we use is spun inside the EU area by Masters of Linen spinners. These spinners only use flax grown by rainwater in France, Netherlands, and Belgium, which requires no irrigation or much fertilising. As a Masters of Linen weaver, Lapuan Kankurit is part of the 100% traceable European chain.

Flax grows quickly, reaching a metre in height in a hundred days' time. It also acts as a carbon sink: its cultivation in Europe binds up to 330 ooo tons of carbon dioxide emissions from the air. It also maintains a healthy biodiversity in the ecosystem. Flax can be utilised in full, and it is a completely biodegradable material. The long staple linen we use is spun according to the OEKO-TEX® standards.

Linen absorbs moisture effectively: a linen towel can soak a lot of moisture without feeling wet. The fibre also releases moisture quickly, so the textiles dry fast. Due to the absorption capacity of linen, less material is required for the products, which is why our linen towels are so light weight. Some of our bath products feature terrycloth, a pleasantly rough material which improves beneficial blood circulation and pampers the skin.

Linen is a durable, inflexible natural fibre. It shines beautifully and repels dirt, which is why it suits well for table settings. When ironed, linen has a shiny surface. Linen has a true natural colour. Linen-coloured textiles are undyed, which means they have only been washed or bleached. Flax fibre does not naturally contain allergenic substances.

We are known for making products that stand the test of time, and our linen products are a perfect example of this: linen only gets better with time and use and can last from generation to generation with correct care.

Flax From Finland in the Future?

Historically, flax has been grown in Finland since the bronze age. Unfortunately, with the development of synthetic fibres flax fields nearly vanished from the Finnish countryside altogether. Luckily, the global interest in the superior qualities of natural fibres is on the rise, and advocates are gearing towards bringing flax cultivation back to Finland on an industrial scale.

We value local materials - and have already invested in Finnsheep wool production, for

"WATER IS THE OLDEST OF OINTMENTS, RAPID-FOAM OF REMEDIES" goes part of a verse in the Finnish national epic Kalevala. For many Finns it's merely a worn out proverb with little substance. For lina Kuustonen, an award-winning Finnish actress and a Unicef Goodwill Ambassador, it seems more akin to a philosophy to live by.

I find water to be incredibly cleansing and healing. Swimming in natural waters brings me back in touch with nature and myself in an instant. It's a whole-body experience, and I think it has something to do with ourselves, as we are both made of water as well as born from it, she muses.

Iina herself inherited her love of water in the womb. Her mother and mother's mother have always been active ice water swimmers, and Iina recalls her mother often telling her: "you can cast all your sorrows in the sea". Iina herself makes it a priority to swim or otherwise be by the water almost all year round. Besides natural waters, a shower after a day of work is her preferred ritual for transitioning, both mentally and physically, from work to home mode.

It's funny when I was younger, I spent most of my money traveling the world. Nowadays I enjoy spending my time here in Finland, whether it's at a lakeside cottage, snowboarding on the powder snow of Lapland, or sailing on the coast and in the archipelagos.

Iina first heard of Lapuan Kankurit from her high school best friend, with whom she has since developed a tradition of exchanging the versatile tea towels as gifts. Collaborations are something Iina commits to with great care and consideration, and she herself was the one to suggest the idea to the co-owner Jaana Hjelt.

Responsibility was one of the main things to bring this collaboration about. Lapuan Kankurit is built on genuine values, which they follow through with actions. Their beautiful relationship with nature is something that can be seen and felt in their textiles. Working with them has felt very organic and enjoyable, Iina shares.

I love the TERVA towels, and the hooded TERVA bathrobe was a treasured companion during last winter's ice swimming trips. My current favourite product, however, is the METSÄLAMPI towel, with the design of the water and forest intermingling. After all, that's how it is, isn't it? Everything is connected.






MAJAMAJA – ECO-LIVING BY THE SEA




